Lieutenant Colonel (Dr.) Kevin Bohnsack is the chief of aerospace medicine (SGP) at Battle Creek Air National Guard Base where he assists in program management for all aerospace, preventive, and occupational medicine activities on base. He is a graduate of the residency in aerospace medicine (RAM) at the USAF School of Aerospace Medicine in San Antonio, TX. He is a family practice-trained flight surgeon and entered active duty service in 2001. Lt Col Bohnsack initially served as a squadron flight surgeon for the Flying Tigers in Kuwait, Afghanistan, and Iraq during initial combat operations. Since that time, he gained additional experiences in Europe, serving as the chief of flight medicine and flight commander at Germany's only remaining fighter air base, and SGP at Offutt AFB, the largest ACC base in the major command. He has also served as the SGP to Manas Air Base, Kyrgyz Republic and Al Dhafra Air Base in Southwest Asia. He has done humanitarian work in and around Bagram, Afghanistan in 2002, Tamale, Ghana for MEDFLAG 2006, and Kauai for Tropic Care 2012. LtCol Bohnsack has over 400 flight hours in over ten different military aircraft.



His wife, Tabitha, is an occupational therapist. They have two daughters, Natalie and Sadie.
